LIVESTOCK GENERAL RULES

CODE OF CONDUCT

EXHIBITORS, PARENTS, AND LEADERS SHALL CONDUCT THEMSELVES IN SUCH A MANNER AS TO BE A CREDIT TO THEMSELVES, TO THEIR CLUB/CHAPTER, AND TO THEIR LEADER/ADVISOR. ALL POLICIES AND PROCEDURES RELATING TO CONDUCT, AS DETERMINED BY THE SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA JR. LIVESTOCK PROGRAM CODE OF CONDUCT WILL BE ENFORCED. COMPETITIVE EVENTS ARE HELD PRIMARILY FOR THEIR EDUCATIONAL VALUE. EXHIBITORS' PARTICIPATION IN ALL FAIR CONTESTS SHALL DISPLAY GOOD SPORTSMANSHIP THROUGHOUT THE FAIR. FAILURE OF AN EXHIBITOR, PARENT, AND LEADER TO SO CONDUCT HIM OR HERSELF OR FAILURE TO ABIDE BY OR FOLLOW ANY APPLICABLE RULE, POLICY OR PROCEDURE SHALL BE GROUNDS FOR DISQUALIFICATION. DISQUALIFICATION MEANS THAT THE EXHIBITOR'S ANIMAL(S) MAY NOT BE SHOWN OR SOLD AT THE AUCTION AND ALL PRIZES, AWARDS, AND MONIES WILL BE FORFEITED. FAILURE TO FORFEIT PRIZES AND AWARDS AND MONIES WILL RESULT IN A LIFETIME BAN FROM ALL FUTURE PARTICIPATION IN SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA JUNIOR LIVESTOCK ALONG WITH THEIR SIBLINGS. LEADERS, ADVISORS, TEACHERS, OR PARENTS WHO BRING EXHIBITORS TO THE FAIR SHALL MAINTAIN THE RESPONSIBILITY AND SUPERVISION OF MINORS AND SHALL ENFORCE PROPER CONDUCT. THE SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA JUNIOR LIVESTOCK COMMITTEE WILL MAKE THE DECISION AFTER LISTENING TO ALL PERSONS WITH DIRECT KNOWLEDGE OF THE ALLEGED MISCONDUCT, INCLUDING THE EXHIBITOR. ALL DECISIONS OF THE SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA JUNIOR LIVESTOCK COMMITTEE ARE FINAL.



EACH CLUB AND OR CHAPTER AND ALL INDEPENDENT SMALL AND LARGE LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS SHALL HAVE EXHIBITORS PRESENT TO ASSIST WITH SET-UP DAY. ALL IN-COUNTY SMALL AND LARGE LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS ARE REQUIRED TO ATTEND AND ASSIST WITH THE TEARDOWN. EACH EXHIBITOR SHALL CHECK OUT WITH THE LIVESTOCK OFFICE AT THE END OF THE TEAR-DOWN. THOSE WHO DO NOT ATTEND AND ASSIST WILL HAVE \$100.00 DEDUCTED FROM THEIR AUCTION CHECK.

Beginning January 1, 2019, the Fairs and Exposition Branch (F&E) will require all California Fairs (County, Citrus & District Agricultural Associations) junior livestock (large and small animal) exhibitors to annually participate in the Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) program. For more information on the YQCA program, please visit www.yqca.org. The exhibitor's YQCA number will be required at the time of entry.



Each livestock exhibitor (large & small) is being asked to contribute to the livestock sponsorship program by bringing in a \$20.00 donation. The sponsorship form may be found on the fair website. Please turn sponsorships in by October 5, 2024

STATE RULES FOR CALIFORNIA FAIRS WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED. FOR A COPY OF STATE RULES GO TO WWW.CDFA.CA.GOV/FE

BREEDING ANIMAL DIVISIONS: MUST BE AT LEAST 9 YEARS OLD BY DECEMBER 31ST OF THE PROGRAM YEAR. BEEF, DAIRY CATTLE, DAIRY GOATS, SHEEP, SWINE, AND JR. BREEDING BOER GOATS ARE OPEN TO 4-H, FFA, AND INDEPENDENT EXHIBITORS FROM RIVERSIDE, IMPERIAL, SAN DIEGO, ORANGE, LOS ANGELES, SAN BERNARDINO, AND VENTURA COUNTIES.

NOTE: PARENTS NEED TO CALL THE 4-H OFFICE TO VERIFY THAT THEIR CHILD'S AGE IS ACCEPTABLE PRIOR TO ENTERING. ONCE ENTRIES CLOSE, FAIR STAFF WILL BE SENDING THE 4-H OFFICE A LIST OF EXHIBITORS TO VERIFY GOOD STANDING FOR AGE AND PROJECTS. NO REFUNDS WILL BE GIVEN FOR ENTRIES REJECTED BY 4-H OFFICE.

MARKET DIVISIONS MUST BE AT LEAST 9 YEARS OLD BY DECEMBER 31ST OF THE PROGRAM YEAR FOR THE LARGE ANIMAL DIVISION. MUST BE AT LEAST 5 YEARS OLD BY JULY 1, 2024, FOR THE SMALL ANIMAL DIVISION. ARE LIMITED TO MEMBERS OF RIVERSIDE COUNTY 4-H CLUBS, FFA CHAPTERS, GRANGE, AND INDEPENDENT JUNIORS. SEE SPECIAL SECTION FOR ELIGIBILITY OF INDEPENDENT JUNIORS.

INDEPENDENT EXHIBITOR: LARGE ANIMAL; MUST BE AT LEAST 9 YEARS OLD BY DECEMBER 31 OF THE

PROGRAM YEAR. SMALL ANIMAL; MUST BE 5 YEARS OLD BY JULY 1, 2024. EXHIBITORS ARE ELIGIBLE TO COMPETE/EXHIBIT THROUGH DEC. 31 OF THE YEAR IN WHICH THEY TURN 19 YEARS OF AGE. INDEPENDENT EXHIBITORS MUST PROVIDE INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR THEIR PROJECT. THEY MUST PRESENT TO THE FAIRGROUNDS 3 PHOTOS OF THEIR ANIMALS WITH AN EXHIBITOR IN EACH PHOTO, FRONT, BACK, AND SIDE, WITH NO COPIES, 120 DAYS PRIOR TO THE OPENING DAY OF THE FAIR FOR BEEF AND 60 DAYS PRIOR TO THE OPENING DAY OF FAIR FOR ALL OTHER ANIMALS. YOU MUST TURN IN THE REQUIRED PAPERWORK TO BE ELIGIBLE TO EXHIBIT. SEE THE INDEPENDENT SECTION IN THE BOOK OR CONTACT FAIR OFFICE.

ALL CHAMPIONS MUST SELL

(Champions plus one other of a large animal species or one small with a max of 3 animals unless an exhibitor has more than 3 champions)

- SALE OF DAIRY REPLACEMENT HEIFER IS IN ADDITION TO THE ABOVE.
- ALL SUPREME AND DIVISION CHAMPIONS AND RESERVE CHAMPION ANIMALS MUST BE SOLD.
- 1. LIMIT: <u>Breeding Animal Show</u>: 12 per Breed. <u>Market Animals</u>: Each Junior exhibitor may enter TWO (2) of each species. In addition to the above limit, one feeder may be entered, but if a feeder is moved into the market due to weight classification and the exhibitor has already met the limit requirement, a decision would have to be made and one animal scratched from the show. Livestock sales will be limited to: those OVER 9 yrs. of age One large or one small animal, UNDER 9 yrs. of age one small animal.
- 2. EACH ANIMAL OR EXHIBIT MUST BE PART OF A PROJECT UNDER SUPERVISION FOR AT LEAST 60 DAYS PRIOR TO THE OPENING DATE OF THE FAIR (120 DAYS PRIOR TO THE OPENING DATE FOR MARKET BEEF AND HORSES.) ALL INDEPENDENT JUNIORS MUST FOLLOW STATE RULES.
- 3. NO EXHIBITS, SIGNS, OR ANIMALS MAY BE REMOVED PRIOR TO MOVE-OUT TIME. CLIPPING CHUTES AND LARGE ITEMS CAN BE REMOVED BEFORE 8:00 AM ON SUNDAY, OCTOBER 15TH, WITHOUT MANAGEMENT PERMISSION.
- 4. Brand inspection papers are mandatory. Original Brand papers and/or Bill of Sale will be required to be turned in to the scale secretary at the time of weigh-in. No beef will be officially accepted until Brand Inspection is complete.
- 5. ALL ANIMALS WILL BE CHECKED UPON ARRIVAL, BEFORE UNLOADING OFF THE TRAILER, FOR FUNGUS, TAIL DOCKS, AND ANY HEALTH CONCERNS. DO NOT PEN UNTIL YOU HAVE BEEN INSPECTED BY HEALTH INSPECTOR. STATE RULES WILL BE ENFORCED.
- 6. 5A. ANY ANIMAL DEVELOPING ANY INFECTIOUS/CONTAGIOUS DISEASES WHILE ON GROUNDS WILL BE
- 7. 5B. ANY ANIMAL FOUND TO BE UNDERWEIGHT WILL BE DISMISSED.
- 8. Any exhibitor force-feeding and/or force-watering animal will be excused from the grounds.
- 9. DISPUTED WEIGHTS: IF THE WEIGHT OF AN ANIMAL THAT DOES NOT MAKE MINIMUM WEIGHT IS DISPUTED, A RE-WEIGHT MUST BE CALLED, THE ANIMAL WILL IMMEDIATELY BE TAKEN OFF THE SCALE, THE SCALE WILL BE RE-BALANCED, AND THE ANIMAL WILL IMMEDIATELY BE RE-WEIGHED. AT NO TIME MAY THE ANIMAL LEAVE THE SCALE AREA. NO RE-WEIGH WILL BE PERMITTED FOR ANY ANIMAL REMOVED FROM THE SCALE AREA.
- 10. CHOICE OF STRAW, SHAVINGS, OR HIGH-QUALITY SAND AS BEDDING WILL BE LEFT TO EACH CLUB, CHAPTER, OR EXHIBITOR.
- 11. Animal Medical Certificates are due when the animal goes across the scale.
- 12. ALL EXHIBITORS WILL BE SUBJECT TO RANDOM RECORD BOOK AUDITING. THESE RECORDS MUST BE AVAILABLE AT THE REQUEST OF FAIR MANAGEMENT.
- 13. SEE STATE RULES FOR IDENTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS OF REGISTERED ANIMALS. THIS IS A JUNIOR SHOW. REGISTRATION PAPERS MUST BE IN THE NAME OF THE JUNIOR ENTERING. THE LENGTH OF OWNERSHIP OF REGISTERED ANIMALS WILL BE DETERMINED BY THE TRANSFER DATE ON REGISTRATION PAPERS. IF THERE IS NO PLACE FOR THE TRANSFER DATE, THE ASSOCIATION RECORDATION DATE IS ACCEPTABLE TO DATE. A BILL OF SALE IS NOT ACCEPTABLE. REGISTRATION MUST BE PRESENTED TO THE LIVESTOCK OFFICE 24 HOURS BEFORE THE SHOW BEGINS.
- 14. ALL GROOMING AND CARE OF ANIMALS IS TO BE DONE BY THE EXHIBITOR AND WITH THE HELP OF OTHER EXHIBITORS ONLY OR YOU COULD BE EXCUSED FROM THE FAIRGROUNDS. ADULTS MAY DO FEEDING MONDAY TO FRIDAY PRIOR TO 9:00 A.M.

- 15. EXTENSION CORDS SHALL BE 15 AMPS MINIMUM AND CONTAIN GROUND WIRE. CORDS NOT MEETING THESE REQUIREMENTS WILL NOT BE PERMITTED. ALL CLUBS, CHAPTERS, AND INDEPENDENT JUNIORS MUST MEET A MINIMUM STANDARD FOR THE UPKEEP OF EXHIBITS AND BARN AREA. EXHIBITORS ARE EXPECTED TO MAINTAIN THEIR PENS, STALLS, AND ANIMALS IN CLEAN AND PRESENTABLE CONDITION THROUGHOUT THE FAIR. ALL PENS, STALLS, AND ANIMALS MUST BE CLEANED BY 9:00 AM. SMALL ANIMAL PENS ARE REQUIRED TO BE CLEANED DAILEY BY 10:00 AM PENS AND STALLS WILL BE "RED TAGGED" FOR NON-COMPLIANCE WITH THIS RULE. THE FIRST RED TAG ISSUED WILL BE A WARNING TO CLEAN THE AREA. A SECOND RED TAG WILL CAUSE A FORFEITURE OF ANY PREMIUM MONEY EARNED AND IF PRIOR TO SALE DAY, THE ANIMAL WILL BE EXCLUDED FROM THE SALES. IF IT IS NECESSARY TO ISSUE A THIRD RED TAG THE EXHIBITOR WILL BE STRIPPED OF ANY SPECIAL AWARDS EARNED AND ASKED TO REMOVE THEIR ANIMALS FROM THE GROUNDS. IF THEY HAVE SOLD AN ANIMAL IN THE AUCTION, THE SALE WILL BE VOIDED. ALL PENNED ANIMALS MUST HAVE WATER IN THEIR PENS AT ALL TIMES!!!!!!
- 16. EACH EXHIBITOR MUST SHOW AND SELL HIS OWN ANIMAL. PRIOR ARRANGEMENTS MUST BE MADE WITH LIVESTOCK MANAGEMENT IN THE EVENT, THIS IS NOT POSSIBLE.
- 17. ALL PERSONS IN THE BARN AREA MUST WEAR CLOSED SHOES.
- 18. NO SMOKING.
- 19. FAIR VETERINARIAN WILL BE ON CALL DURING THE SHOW. THE VETS PHONE NUMBER WILL BE AVAILABLE IN THE LIVESTOCK OFFICE. THE EXHIBITOR IS RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY CHARGES MADE BY THE VETERINARIAN.
- 20. Non-compliance with any local or State rule may result in forfeiture of cash awards and, if determined, removal from grounds.
- 21. Age Requirements for showing large animals are Nine years (9) or older to show large animals. Under 9 years may show small animals only, Rabbits, Cavy, and Poultry. The minimum age is 5 years old as of 6/1/23. Exhibitors are eligible to compete/exhibit through Dec. 31 of the year in which they turn 19 years of age.
- 22. No foreign objects may be used: No artificial tails fins or twine may be used on market cattle.
- 23. DECISIONS AND PROTESTS: 2024 STATE RULE BOOK: "PROTESTS WILL BE CONSIDERED ONLY IF THERE HAS BEEN A VIOLATION OF STATE OR LOCAL RULES. DECISIONS OF JUDGES, VETERINARIANS, HEALTH CHECK OFFICIALS, AND TIMERS CANNOT BE PROTESTED AND ARE FINAL. 2024 STATE RULE BOOK: "PROTESTS MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY A DEPOSIT OF EITHER \$500.00 (CASH, MONEY ORDER OR CERTIFIED CHECK MADE PAYABLE TO THE FAIR) NOTE: THE DEPOSIT WILL BE RETURNED IF THE PROTEST IS UPHELD. IF THE PROTEST IS UPHELD, THE VIOLATOR MAY BE HELD LIABLE FOR ANY PORTION OF THE DIRECT COSTS INCURRED BY THE FAIR IN THE COURSE OF THE PROTEST RESOLUTION. FAILURE TO REIMBURSE THE FAIR SHALL BE CAUSE FOR DISALLOWING FUTURE ENTRIES IN ANY OF THE NETWORKS OF CALIFORNIA FAIRS."
- 24. THE SHOW ORDER IS SUBJECT TO CHANGE TO RUN SHOWS SMOOTHLY.
- 25. EXHIBITORS, PARENTS, LEADERS, OR THEIR AGENTS WILL NOT BE PERMITTED TO CONVERSE WITH JUDGES DURING THE SHOW.
- 26. There is to be no eating, cooking, or food prep of any kind in the barns. All drinks need to be lidded.

UNIFORMS

ALL FFA, 4-H AND GRANGE MEMBERS EXHIBITING LIVESTOCK MUST WEAR THE OFFICIAL UNIFORM OF THEIR ORGANIZATION WHILE SHOWING OR SELLING THEIR ANIMALS. RING STEWARDS WILL CHECK FOR A COMPLETE ORGANIZATION UNIFORM WHEN A MEMBER ENTERS THE SHOW RING.

THE OFFICIAL FFA SHOW UNIFORM TO BE WORN BY ALL FFA EXHIBITORS AND BY HELPERS, IN INDIVIDUAL AND CHAPTER GROUPS WHILE SHOWING AT FAIRS AND LIVESTOCK SHOWS SHALL CONSIST OF ANKLE-LENGTH WHITE, DARK BLUE OR BLACK TROUSERS, WHITE DRESS SHIRT (SHORT OR LONG-SLEEVED T-SHIRTS ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE) WITH THE FFA EMBLEM ATTACHED TO THE LEFT POCKET AND THE OFFICIAL FFA FOUR-IN-HAND NECKTIE. THE OFFICIAL FFA JACKET IS OPTIONAL, IF WORN THE SHIRT EMBLEM IS NOT REQUIRED. HATS OR HEADGEAR OF ANY KIND SHALL NOT BE WORN WITH THE OFFICIAL SHOW UNIFORM WHILE SHOWING.

FOR THE FAIR, THE OFFICIAL 4-H UNIFORM CONSISTS WHITE, OFF-WHITE, OR DARK BLUE SLACKS OR JEANS, (ANKLE LENGTH), A WHITE TAILORED BLOUSE/SHIRT (T-SHIRTS), LONG OR SHORT SLEEVED, (NO SLEEVELESS) GREEN 4-H COLLAR, OR GREEN 4-H TIE, AND 4-H CAP.

FOR FAIR, THE OFFICIAL UNIFORM FOR INDEPENDENT JUNIORS CONSISTS OF WHITE OR BLUE DENIM PANTS, A WHITE LONG OR SHORT-SLEEVE SHIRT, (NO T-SHIRTS PERMITTED), A BELT, AND CLOSED-TOED SHOES.

CLEAN BARN AWARD

HERE'S YOUR CHANCE TO BE RECOGNIZED FOR YOUR SPARKLE N' SHINE!

KEEP YOUR PROJECTS AND SPACES CLEAN AND ORGANIZED BECAUSE THE SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA FAIR IS GIVING OUT TWO AWARDS FOR THE CLEANEST AND MOST PRESENTABLE ALL-AROUND GROUPS EXHIBITING ON THE FAIRGROUNDS. THE GROUP MUST DISPLAY A CLUB/CHAPTER SIGN. EXTRA POINTS MAY BE GIVEN FOR DISPLAYING EDUCATIONAL MATERIAL/INFORMATION. ONE AWARD WILL BE GIVEN IN EACH OF THE FOLLOWING CATEGORIES:

- 1) LARGE ANIMAL
- 2) SMALL ANIMAL

Clean Barn Rules & Guidelines:

- 1. The Livestock Superintendent will make inspections at unannounced times each day by a committee appointed.
- 2. All Clubs/Chapters must have a sign clearly visible for the duration of the Fair. If the group's sign is displayed that is an automatic entry for the contest. If signs are not displayed, the Club/Chapter will not be considered for any awards.

Are the Alleyways free of straw, litter, and hazardous equipment:	20 pts
Are the pens clean and fresh appearing:	20 pts
Are the animals free of soil, watered, appear fed, and well kept:	20 pts
Does the youth show respect for the public and fellow exhibitors:	5 pts
Is the display creatively and attractively arranged? Does it show member planning and involvement	nt: 15 pts
Is there educational material: Does the club/chapter have a member on duty to clean the area & to answer Questions:	15 pts
